Dear Chairman Faber:

On behalf of the City Council, I acknowledge receipt of the County's recent request for amended budgets from the Joint Powers Fire Board and the Joint Powers Public Land Board.

Last Wednesday, April 19, our respective elected bodies held our annual budget meeting with the Joint Powers Boards and their trusted staff. Both boards presented carefully developed budgets that included well-supported requests for additional critical personnel.

The City's position is that we have placed our trust in the appointed boards and their staff; we recognize the essential services that they provide to our community. As such, the City stands ready to fully fund the budget requests as presented on April 19 and according to the distribution of funding as stated in our current joint powers agreements. We further recognize that given the time required for negotiation and State approval, it is wholly unreasonable to consider any attempts to amend the existing agreements for this budget cycle.

Respecting the time-sensitive need to finalize our budgets for the upcoming fiscal year, City Council is open to scheduling another public meeting to continue the discussions for funding these important organizations and their dedicated staff.

Gillette Avenue Added to National Register of Historic Places Downtown Gillette Becomes An Historic District

Gillette received its third location on the National Register of Historic Places on January 3, 2023.

The National Register of Historic Places was authorized by the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, according to the U.S. Park Service, and it "is part of a national program to coordinate and support public and private efforts to identify, evaluate, and protect America's historic and archeological resources."

Nine blocks of South Gillette Avenue, from 1st Street to 7th Street, contain buildings that significantly contribute to the historic nature of the City of Gillette.

Key buildings in the district include 100 South Gillette Avenue (Montgomery Bar and Hotel) built in 1911; 200 South Gillette Avenue (Pat's Hallmark), the former Bank of Gillette built in 1920; and 610 South Gillette Avenue, the Chasell House, constructed in 1906 and representing residential Victorian architecture.

"The Gillette Downtown Historic District represents an important part of Wyoming's history and culture and is an excellent addition to the National Register of Historic Places," said Bethany Kelley, National Register Coordinator for the State Historic Preservation Office.

In total, 30 buildings are now listed as part of the "Gillette Downtown Historic District", with 25 excluded either because they were too modern or had undergone too much change in the past century.

"The creation of an Historic District downtown adds dozens of buildings to the register at one time and was a great way for us to catch Gillette up with other cities in Wyoming in recognizing our historic value," said Brenda Kirk, who serves on the Gillette Historic Preservation Commission.

Gillette, along with Douglas, became the 12th and 13th downtown historic districts in Wyoming in 2023. They join Casper, Cheyenne, Cody, Evanston, Lander, Laramie, Rawlins, Rock Springs, Thermopolis, and Wheatland on the National Register. Wyoming has 577 landmarks or historic places listed on the register. There are now 6 national listings in Campbell County. The others are the former Gillette Post Office (301 S. Gillette Avenue), the former Gillette City Hall (400 S. Gillette Avenue), and three archeological sites in the county.

"We'd like to thank the Wyoming State Historic Preservation Office, Bob and Betty Lu Rosenberg, and all the property and business owners in downtown Gillette for all that they have done to get us here," said Robert Henning, Vice President of the Gillette Historic Preservation Commission.

A ribbon cutting celebrating the occasion is scheduled for Friday, May 5, at 12:15pm, at the Third Street Plaza on 3rd Street downtown.

The Gillette Historic Preservation Commission was created by the City of Gillette in 2015 to protect, enhance and perpetuate significant historical, archeological and architectural relics within the City of Gillette and the surrounding area.


