7/6/2023

FACILITIES

- Insurance
 - Windmill Shower Building - Claim number FNK6661
 - Completion of work is still anticipated before NHSFR, however; has lingered longer than projected by Powder River due to some plumbing install delays. There is also a delay in the delivery of the ADA restroom stall dividers that will be satisfied with a temporary/used product until the correct unit arrives.
 - Ongoing Hail Claim
 - Weather continues to delay progress. Heritage Theater work is nearing completion. Central/East dryvit was to begin last week, however; with event schedules and rain it will now be delayed until the fall.
 - The roof repair of East appears to have addressed most of the leaks.
 - Annual Insurance Renewal
 - With the continued excellent help of Shelby Means, our HUB broker, we were able to negotiate a renewal of our various lines of insurance coverage below the anticipated rate increase. Premium Renewal of \$275,678 or an increase of 11.5% over the prior year premium, which is substantially under our quoted initial increase assessment of 22%. While this is welcome news we have seen our premium raise substantially in 2022 and we are working proactively with HUB to evaluate every line of coverage. Increasing deductibles did not produce any cost savings over the quoted premiums in 2023.

MAJOR PROJECTS & EVENTS

- NHSFR
 - NHSFR representatives will arrive on grounds July 7th. First contestants will check in July 12th at Noon.
 - Our greatest concern area is weather and the conditions it has left in our stall areas. The wet weather combined with the heavy use in the permanent stall areas have left massive rutting issues that must be addressed. The rain has left much of Boxelder stalls under standing water and we are working to identify solutions such as sump pumps and vac trucks given that we are anticipating additional daily rainfall. This is a major operational preparedness concern; however, we are working through plans to address it. As of drafting this email, pending any new/unforeseen issues we will be all facilities will be prepared and operational for rodeo as needed / intended.

- **POPULOUS – MASTER PLANNING UPDATE**

Bi-weekly touchpoint meetings have taken place since the last in-person workshop. Populous team is fine tuning the site planning along with DOWL developing the civil infrastructure elements. Initial sewer and water plans have been put forward for review along with a focused programming effort on a greenway to tie together the entire campus and continued suggested modifications to East and Central Pavilion. Todd Gralla with Populous will be joining us on July 18th to meet with the NHSFR Directors to discuss the approach to site planning and addressing the needs of the NHSFR in balance with needs of CAM-PLEX in the site planning process. Following this meeting we will review feedback from NHSFR and begin a more focused financial modeling process to vet the block facility programming that we have been working through to this point.

- **AMPHITHEATER/OUTDOOR EVENT SITE UPDATE**

Grass is planted and growing! The first sprouts were seen June 25th. Pivot is operational and working as planned. Specialized airless self-mending tires are installed. The temporary watering system in the Southeast corner by the Fire Station is installed and working. Rain has been creating a few wash-out areas; however, these will be easily addressed once the main germination takes hold. The connecting road/path to the amphitheater site is the next development project in the pipeline. Hard scaping will need to be addressed in the fall. DRM has completed the fence line re-installation. The fence between the site and the firehouse needs to be addressed and Chief Bender and I will be meeting on site after rodeo to further develop plans for the scope of the fence. Once the weather allows we will begin erecting barriers to indicate and protect the seeded areas.

- **CAMPOREE 2024**

On June 16th I again pressed for an update on the status of the portable toilets contract. I learned that Camporee still did not have a contract for portable toilets and that it was likely that we would need to use the \$340K identified in the camporee contract for supplementing the local inventory of portables. There is a discrepancy in the number of 700 units (figure provided to me by Camporee that they would like us to purchase) and what \$340K can actually purchase. Likely less than half of that for units that would last more than one Camporee event. I am meeting with service providers to gain an accurate understanding of the total need for the event, and have requested Camporee provide an operational plan for managing this safety and health issue. With a public bid process, and lead time for delivery, assembly, etc., I am concerned about the pragmatism of purchasing \$340K worth of portable units without an operational plan in place for how they will be stocked and serviced during the event and what our plan for them will be after the event. I am hearing it will take roughly 8-10 service trucks working 12-hour days to service the event grey water and portable toilet needs. Currently this capacity does not exist by any one provider in our local market.

There is no update on the Wyoming Outdoor Recreation Grant as of the drafting of this update.

OPERATIONS HIGHLIGHTS

- 307 Horse Racing has completed their season. Weather was a major challenge; however, I believe they had a very successful season. It is my hope that we have taken positive steps in improving our service and facility delivery over this season. Now having seen a full season, there are operational recommendations that I am preparing to discuss with horse racing in order to clean up contract language that will assist everyone in continuing to improve the experience for all. We also have facility issues that need to be addressed prior to next year to ensure that we can be more efficient with our time and resources. Specifically, repair/replacement of damaged phone lines, stall cleaning processes and parking controls.

- While NHSFR is eminent upon us, we have also been preparing for our immediate transition from rodeo to Fair. With two days to turnover the grounds, it will be a difficult push, however, the facility planning is well in hand and it will be an issue of manpower and execution of the plan.
- Working to finalize a CCSD Plan for the management of CCSD events at Cam-Plex that supports our mutual goals of providing access to the facilities, while still ensuring we can execute events safely and efficiently. CCSD has given us their preferred list of dates and we are looking forward to next years programming.
- We have secured the rights to present 12 movies over the next year. This programming will be accompanied with activities that are in keeping with the theme of the movies. Packages will be sold through out box office and there will be programs for all ages. This is the first time in man years that CAM-PLEX will be offering a self-produced series of programs open to the general public of this nature. Our focus is matching the interests of the community to programming here at Cam-Plex. Activities are planned in partnership with area organizations such as Area 59 and the themes will be built around the subject matter of the film. Think of a dinosaur dig in the lobby and watching Jurassic Park for the feature film. (Won't be that film showing) We will debut the series in the coming weeks.
- We have entered into an agreement with the Fly-Fishing Film Festival to be a tour destination for the film festival that tours the nation annually.

- STAFFING UPDATE
 - We have hired Steve Yount, as our newest Sales Manager. Steve is coming to us from the Campbell County School District. He begins on July 6th.
 - We have hired Taylor Ortega as our new front desk receptionist/administrative assistant. Taylor has experience working in service organizations and is coming to us most recently from the Denver area where she worked with the Boys and Girls Club organization there.
 - We continue to interview for the open maintenance technician and event technician positions. There are seasonal part time positions we have filled to address the labor needs for rodeo and fair.
