Storm Event Overview:

Snow was expected from Thursday October 26th through Sunday October 29th. Streets Night crew was placed "on call" for Wednesday through Saturday, and Day crew placed "on call" for Saturday. The snow began falling about 6 a.m. Thursday morning and the Day crew responded immediately.

Thursday 10/26/2023

Day crew came in at 7:00 a.m. with light snow, temps at 16 degrees, and winds of 10 mph. Roadways became slick by 8:00 a.m. Light snow continued throughout the morning and by the afternoon, the snowfall was much heavier. With the continued snow fall roadways were snow covered and slick from 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Day crew operated until 7:00 p.m. focusing on the East, Central, West, Downtown, and Trouble priorities. Approximately 4 inches of snow fell by 7:00 p.m.

Thursday Night

The night crew took over operations at 7:00 p.m. and continued plowing priorities. There was light snowfall with an additional 1 inch of accumulation. Winds around 15 mph and with the temperature dropping to near record cold. The storm moved quickly through the area and the snowfall stopped at 8:00 p.m. Night crew worked on routes for eight hours; laying material and removing drifts from roadways. Road conditions were good and would continue to hold until the following day. With the storm ending and conditions clearing, road conditions were safe.

Event 1 was closed at 3:00 a.m. Friday morning.



The Evolution of the Campbell County Chamber of Commerce

The Campbell County Chamber of Commerce was established in 1956 by a like-minded group of businessmen, including D.A. "Kelly" Swenson. They formed the Chamber to be able to provide a unified voice for business – to do together what couldn't be done alone.

The Chamber office has been in downtown Gillette since inception. Their first home was in an old frame building in the approximate location of Sole Mates at 211 S. Gillette Ave. Their second location was in the Stockman's Café building. In 1966, the Chamber put a downpayment on the current building at 314 S. Gillette Ave.

The Chamber's board of directors realized many years ago that the Chamber was outgrowing the space at 314 S. Gillette Ave. The search for a new office space spanned at least the last 20 years. Money was set aside as it was available and designated as a "building fund". Consideration was given to remodeling and adding on to the office, but the cost was prohibitive.

Many different options were considered over the years, none of which panned out. Recently, a new office space was identified. Debates and discussions were had, pros and cons of moving discussed, and finally a decision was made.

The Chamber is relocating to 409 W. 2nd Street in November of 2023. The new office space is much larger which will allow the Chamber to expand services offered and provide more value to its members and the community. The board and staff are excited to make this move and will continue to be a part of the downtown community while being more visible and easier to access.

In June of 2020, the Campbell County Convention and Visitors Bureau moved into the Chamber office. The two entities co-located in the same building but remained separate entities. The CVB will remain at 314 S. Gillette Ave. to continue to provide great service to our visitors and community members. They will also have more space and will be able to provide more services in the future. The Gillette Main Street organization will join the CVB and will be better able to serve the downtown merchants in a more visible location.
