City Mails Survey to Identify Lead & Copper Water Service Lines

The City of Gillette has mailed surveys to approximately 750 water customers to help identify lead water service lines. Residents receiving the surveys are asked to complete and return them to the City Water Division.

The surveys are part of a nationwide project initiated by the passage of the federal Lead and Copper Revised Rule (LCRR) in December of 2021. The LCRR is intended to better protect communities from the risks of lead exposure in drinking water. In addition to enhanced testing, the LCRR requires an inventory of all pipe materials from water mains to privately-owned homes and structures. If lead service lines are identified, the LCRR also provides for the removal and replacement of lead service lines.

The City of Gillette does not have any City-owned lead service lines. In addition, records indicate that there are very few, if any, privately-owned lead service lines in Gillette. Installation of lead service lines largely ended in the 1930's. Lead was banned in the United States as a water system material in the late 1980s. As a result, surveys were mailed only to a portion of addresses with service lines installed before 1988. Additional homes falling in this category will have surveys mailed to them early next year.

FIREWORKS RESOLUTION - NEW YEAR'S

RESOLUTION NO. 3059

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners, Campbell County, Wyoming, that enforcement of the prohibition of the sale and use of fireworks as provided by Resolution of this Board dated July 9, 1985, shall be stayed for the period from and after 12:01 a.m., December 26, 2023, to and until 12:01 a.m., January 2, 2024.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the sale and use of fireworks during the time periods outlined above, shall be limited by the following terms and conditions:

- 1. No fireworks shall be ignited within 100 feet of a residence.
- 2. Any fireworks ignited shall be done so that it does not cause a fire.
- 3. Possession, sale, or use of fireworks, commonly referred to as "pop bottle rockets," is prohibited.
- 4. All Fireworks vendors must register and provide contact information with the Campbell County Fire Department.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that from and after 12:01 a.m. January 2, 2024, the prohibition prescribed by the Resolution of July 9, 1985, shall be in full force and effect.

Storm Event Overview:

A winter storm advisory was in affect for the Gillette area beginning Thursday, November 23, 2023, through Friday, November 24, 2023. Snow accumulation was expected to be four to nine inches. Level 1 snow emergency was declared on November 22, 2023, at 2:30 p.m. Streets crews were placed on snow call Wednesday November 22, 2023, Thursday November 23, 2023, and Friday November 24, 2023. Snow fall began on Thursday, November 23,2023, around 1:00 p.m. The Streets Day crew was called out at 4:00 p.m. with reports of slick roadway conditions.

Thursday 11/23/2023

Day crew came in at 4:00 p.m. on Thanksgiving Day. Light snow, temperatures at 21 degrees, and winds around 10-20 mph. Roads were wet from snowfall and temperatures quickly dropped to 15 degrees causing the roadways to become icy and slick. Day crew operated until 7:00 p.m. focusing on the East, Central, West, Downtown, and Trouble priorities. Approximately 1 inch of snow fell by 7:00 p.m.

Thursday Night

The Night crew took over operations at 7:00 p.m. and continued plowing priorities. Light snowfall continued with an additional 2 inches of accumulation, winds around 20 mph, and temperatures dropping to a low of 15 degrees. The night crew worked on routes for 12 hours; laying material on intersections and continued to inspect roadway conditions.

Friday 11/24/2023

Day crew relieved the Night crew, taking over operations at 7:00 a.m. Light snow flurries continued in the morning, temperatures began to rise, and the roadways began to clear. Day crew continued to clear roads, curbed all routes, and wrapped up operations at 2:00 p.m.

Event 2 was closed at 2:00 p.m. Friday afternoon.

Level 1 snow emergency ended Saturday, November 25, 2023, at 8:00 a.m.


The forecast predicted more snow, but Gillette was located on the edge of the storm, resulting in a shorter event than expected.




