8.1.1 Financial Report

Director of Finance, Juli Pierce, presented the Financials. Ending cash balance as of 5/31/2024 was \$3,689,668.02. WyoStar Vehicle Depreciation Account balance as of 4/30/2024 \$3,802,520.75 with Unencumbered Funds at \$3,182,109.00 and account balance at \$4,179,109.00. Facilities Maintenance account ending balance on was \$214,179.37, with Unencumbered Funds totaling \$134,179.37. Equipment Replacement ending balance is \$689,950.73, with Unencumbered total of \$556,980.49.

FY 2023-2024 BUDGET VS ACTUAL

Director of Finance, Juli Pierce reported that nothing had changed with the Budget vs Actual since the prior month and we would go over the end of the year next month.

8.2 ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS: Fire Chief Bender

Fire Chief Bender reminded the Board that the floating positions did come about and were not approved. With the fund balance we will be looking to silo some of that money and work closely with our Finance Director, and you, the Board. The next two full-time career fire fighters are working the Seasonal shifts and are on point to continue on the training path. We will stay on top of the Overtime budget and numbers and be smart about that and report it to the Board.

The Burn Restrictions went into effect July 5 at 0700 and Fire Chief Bender met with Commissioners to be an advisor on the matter.

The Chief will keep dispatch discussions at the forefront of communications with the City and Sherriff’s office to make sure all our Stations are getting the best information and alerts from the dispatch terminal. Phase I discussion of the new Training Center is still on-going and we need to be sure we stay on top of it, because in 2 years, we will be losing the facility to train and qualify of Firefighters. The Pathfinders and Camporee are still on track, and we are still staying in touch with the planning and organizers to make sure it is a success. Station 7 will be fully staffed during the week of the event.

8.2 Facilities Update/General Information

Fire Chief Bender stated that Station 1 has been updated with fiber optics and all computers and systems are functioning. Division Chief Ryan Fox confirmed Station 7 fence is up and provides the barrier for large crowds affiliated with Camporee and future large groups. Warranty walk-through with landscape company went well. Two tress will be replaced. The sprinkler system will get two more repairs. Brian Shippee will stay on to satisfy the work.

Jamie Tarver with the Community for Campbell County P.A.C. gave the board an update on their campaign efforts regarding the Cam-plex expansion tax proposition that is on the ballot.

5.1 Executive Director’s Report – Staff updated the board on the conclusion of the 307 Horse Racing season, the 4th of July fireworks show, and preparations for the upcoming fair week.

5.2 Facilities & Operations- Staff reported on current general maintenance items, including repair of the Wyoming Center HVAC system and pump station repairs.

5.3 Events- Staff provided updates on events scheduled for the month of July.

5.4 Finance- Staff provided updates on investments and the current liquid interest rate which is at 5.18%. Year-end capital expenditures are being completed. Special events/RAPP projects are being built out in the financial system and year-end reports are being prepared for the auditor.

6.2 Fair Update- Plans for fair week are on track. Livestock panels are becoming more of an issue. Throughout the years, panels have been purchased and are not compatible, even within the same brand. This issue contributes to inefficient set-up. The need for a solution to this problem was discussed by the board and staff.

6.3 Camporee Update – Insurance specifications are being understood by Camporee representatives. Load in for the nighttime space begins July 22nd. Shower house locations 1,2,4,5,6, & 7, will also be installed at that time. Installation of shower house 3 will wait until the fair is over. The week beginning July 29th Camporee volunteers will begin to show up on site with 40,000 people expected the following week. The COW tower is set up and expected to provide exceptional coverage during the event. The amphitheater grass has required an exorbitant amount of water given how dry the weather has been and the high temperatures.

6.4 Schedule Change August Board Meeting - Due to the International Pathfinders Camporee event, the board discussed changing the date of their regular monthly meeting to avoid scheduling conflicts.

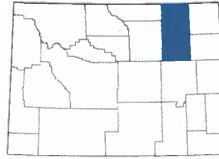
